## **Summary**

In 2023 we focused on adding new content as well as updating old content on our Web Portal and on our YouTube channel.

## Web Portal Strategy

In 2023, we continued to follow our "tic-tactoe" strategy. "Tic" is keeping our Web portal up to date with the latest information technology trends. "Tac" is publishing new content. "Toe" is design — the user interface and user experience of our Web portal.

*Tic*. In 2023, we completed the changes to drop support for older web browsers on our Web portal. While some older browsers may continue to work, we recommend always using the latest version.

*Tac.* 2023 was a "tac" year. We continued to publish our monthly opinion editorials giving an indigenous peoples' perspective on current events. Our opinion editorials represent independent journalism and are entirely uninfluenced by corporate interests or media advertising.

We also updated many of our photoethnographic essays. The main updates were to the page layout.

These essays were originally written many years ago. At that time, technologies such as high-efficiency image compression, lazy loading and resource caching were not available. They are now standard in website design.

In recent years, we changed the template of our photo-ethnographic essays page to take advantage of these technologies. This allows for larger, higher quality images without sacrificing page load times.

*Toe.* We made a number of small design changes and optimizations to a few sections of our Web portal.

#### Social Media

In 2023, we decided to halt our social media presence. While we believe that social media can play an important role for non-profit organizations to communicate, we also believe that social media platforms have become a net negative asset for the global community.

We currently have no plans to return to social media.

### **Resources**

The resources on our Web portal continued to be used extensively by non-governmental, non-profit and media organizations, interns, government agencies, publishing companies, journalists, students and educators around the world.
